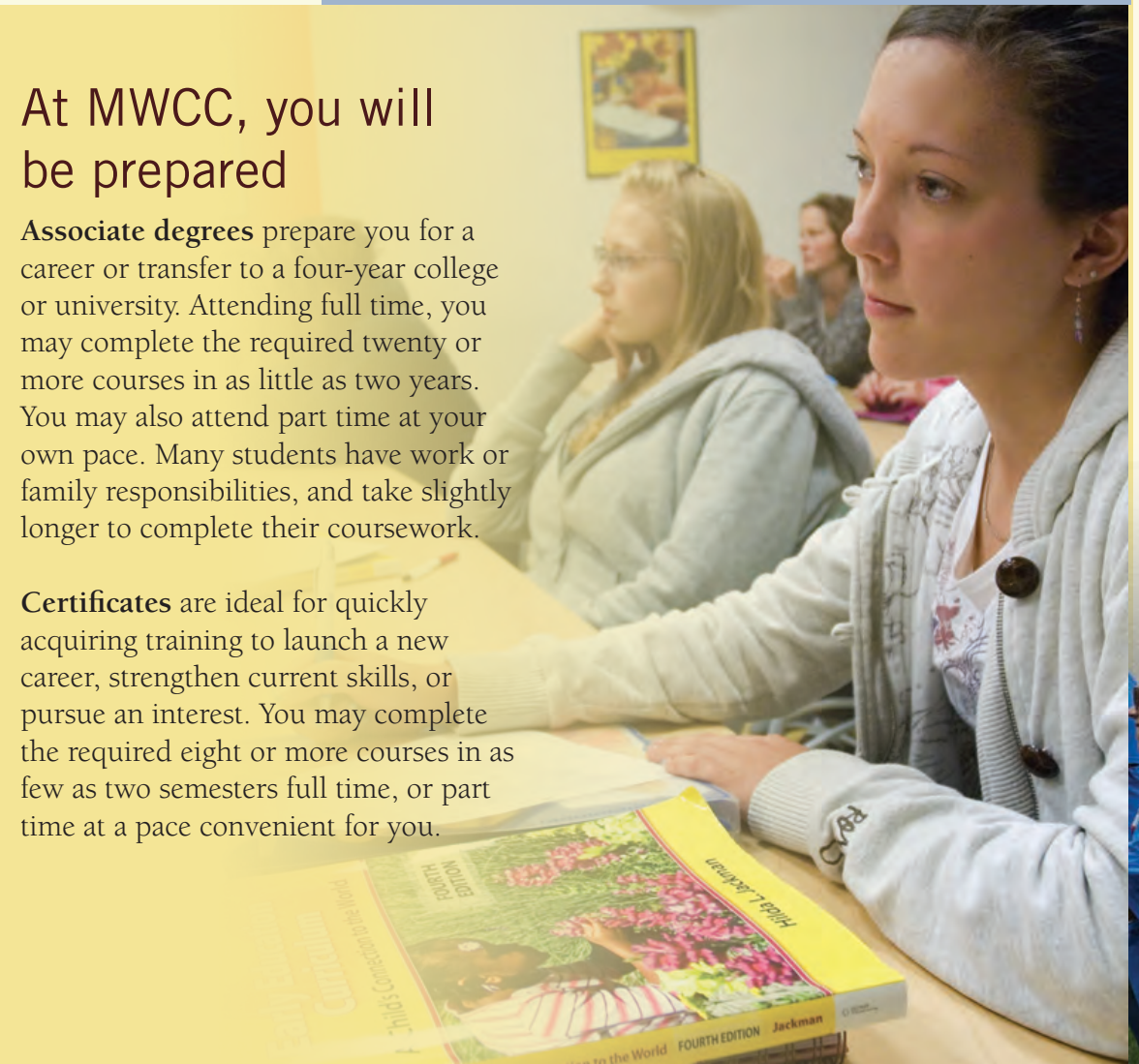


Associate Degrees and Certificates

From Fitchburg and Points East:

Route 2 West to Route 140 North (Exit 24B). Exit sign reads "140 North to Winchendon and Ashburnham." Proceed three miles on this route. Pass through two traffic lights. Proceed one-half mile past the second light and take a left turn onto Matthews Street. The college entrance is one mile on the right.

From Western and Central

Massachusetts: Route 2 East to Route 140 North (Exit 24). Turn left at the end of the exit ramp. Proceed three miles on this route. Pass through two traffic lights. Proceed one-half mile past the second light and take a left turn onto Matthews Street. The college entrance is one mile on the right.

From Worcester and Providence:

I-190 North from Worcester. From I-190, take Route 2 West to Route 140 North (Exit 24B). Exit sign reads "140 North to Winchendon and Ashburnham." Proceed one-half mile past the second light and take a left turn onto Matthews Street. The college entrance is one mile on the right.

From Points North:

Route 12 South to Route 140 South. Bear right onto Green Street. The college is one-half mile on the left.

From Points East: Route 2 West to Exit 31B – Route 12 North. At the end of the exit ramp, go right. At the lights, take a right onto Erdman Way.
